If you are unsure about an item, please speak to a member of staff. Parents are reminded that they must notify staff of any known or suspected allergy to nuts and provide all necessary information.


Surestart

Road Safety and Car Parking

Please remind all children that they are to dismount all bikes and scooters at the school gates in the morning and walk their bikes and scooters on school grounds. Similarly all bikes and scooters must be walked to the gates after school.
