The suffix 'ous' (meaning 'full of') is added to a word to make an adjective.

danger +ous = dangerous

allow + ed = allowed

The suffix 'ly' is added to the end of an adjective to make an adverb.

Rule: If the 'y' at the end of a word is preceded by a consonant then 'y' changes into 'i' before adding 'ly', e.g. happy - happily.

'ly' is added straight on to many root words without any change to the word, e.g. sad - sadly, final - finally but

greed - greedily

speed - speedily
